Description

Every year, from 1987-2003, a special art exhibition would take place in Conway, Washington: The Barn Show. A group of artists would display their artwork in a barn for their friends and family to see. Today you will build a barn, create your own paintings and sculptures and host a Barn Show of your own!

<u>Materials</u>

- Templates of the barn's sides/roof and picture frames to cut out (included at the end of this lesson)
- Tape
- Kid-friendly scissors
- Pencil
- Crayons, markers, colored pencils or other drawing tools

Instructions

- Watch the <u>Video of Howard Shapiro</u> to get you started!
- Begin by cutting out the barn template.
- Then, color the sides and roof of the barn. Get creative, you can use any colors and patterns you like!
- Tape the sides of the barn together and carefully cut open the doors.
- Fold the lines on the roof and tape the folded shape to the sides of the barn.
- Using the picture frames, create mini-artworks to decorate your barn.
- Finally, cut out and hang your art display in the barn using tape. Celebrate, your Barn Show is complete!






Here are all the templates you need to create your own barn. Grab your scissors and have fun!


Cut these pieces out to make the sides of your barn.

Cut these pieces out to make the front and back of your barn.

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Cut this piece out and fold along the thicker lines to make the roof of your barn.



Cut these out and create some art to hang in your barn!
